Both Moodle and Microsoft Teams are used by Hereford Sixth Form College part of the Heart of Mercia Multi-Academy Trust. These platforms are used to host teaching and learning resources and activities. Moodle and Teams are designed to be accessible however, they are also highly customisable. Authors are free to create and upload content and resources of their choosing. As a result, it is not possible to guarantee that all hosted content is fully accessible.
