



THE LAW & POLITICS DEPARTMENT

Law and Politics is a successful department currently delivering two distinct A Level courses. A-Level Law is a particularly popular subject and this academic year we have started the new linear programme with OCR. A successful candidate will be expected to teach Law A level to both Year 1 and Year 2. They will work with staff in the department to help maintain and build on past achievements by bringing not only enthusiasm and commitment, but also new ideas to a department which welcomes innovation. The sharing of good practice, including lesson resources, is actively encouraged in order to deliver highly effective courses that enable students to achieve excellent results (in 2017 72% of students achieved A*-B).

The successful candidate will need to assist in not only the delivery of the subject but also creating and amending law materials, as well as keep abreast of new developments. Initially we require someone to teach part-time together with the Criminology department.

The department runs several successful trips (to Parliament, subject knowledge conferences, the courts and in 2016 Washington and New York). All staff assist with the running of trips and suggestions for new trips will always be welcomed.

With regard to teaching facilities, the department is equipped with three teaching rooms, two of which with interactive whiteboards. The department also has a office/staff workroom where all members of staff are provided with their own desk and networked computer. The office also houses a member of departmental resource books for the improvement of subject knowledge.
